We offer a range of intensive, home-based, early-intervention support services to improve the lives of Otago children and their families.


We support children, expectant mothers, parents and families to achieve good education, social and health outcomes by:

- visiting expectant parents and parents in their homes to provide information about how to care for their child, and what to expect at each stage of child development
- providing information and guidance about parenting skills and managing child behaviour
- linking families to community resources and support networks.

What you can expect from our services:

Our services are:

- available throughout Otago
- voluntary
- free of charge
- for all people regardless of their beliefs
- client-led: you set the goals you want to achieve for your children and family.

We also offer:

- Family therapy and counselling to help individuals identify strategies that will support them to manage life's often complex and sometimes unexpected challenges.
- OCEANS Grief and Loss Programme (North Otago only) which provides an opportunity for children or young people who are missing someone in their lives (through separation or death) to share and learn from other children who have experienced a similar loss.
- Restorative Justice which offers victims of a crime an opportunity to address the harm done and put things right.
- Social workers in seven Dunedin schools who provide support to help children who have some challenges at school or home to integrate fully into school life.
- Emergency, short term and respite care for children from birth to 16 years.
